The message of these entertaining creatures is simple: Don't feed the waste beast too much. Avoid all unnecessary litter and remember sorting your waste!

SDG 9 – “Save the Planet” by Georgy Pogosyan

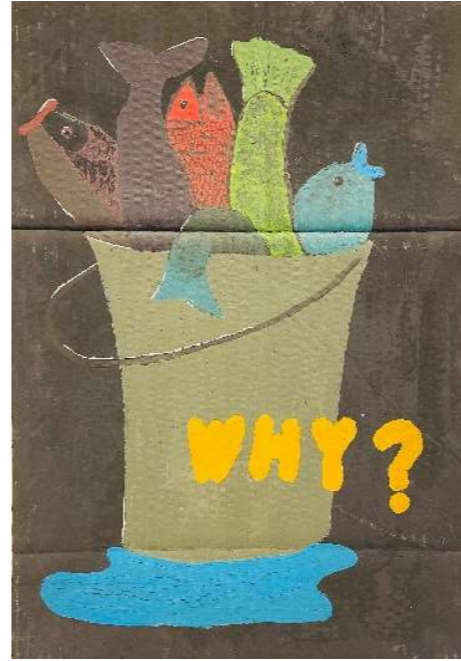

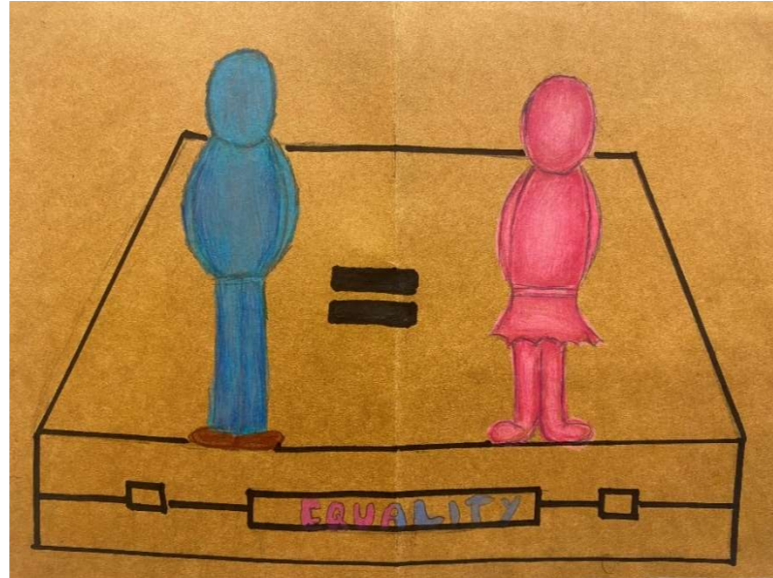


SDG 16 – “The World needs Peace” by Rebecca Sadati-Seyede

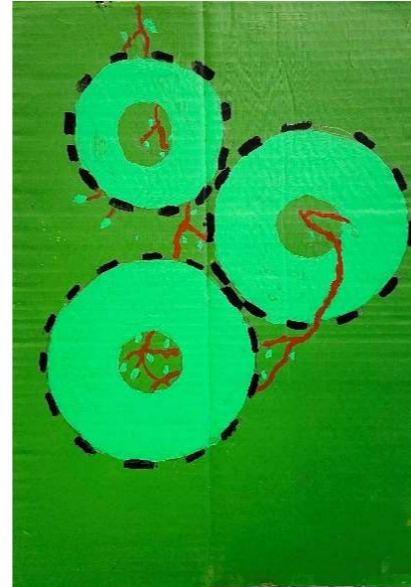
I hope that this art piece motivates people to bring a lot more peace into their surroundings and kindness towards everyone. I also hope it inspires people to promote fairness and equality.

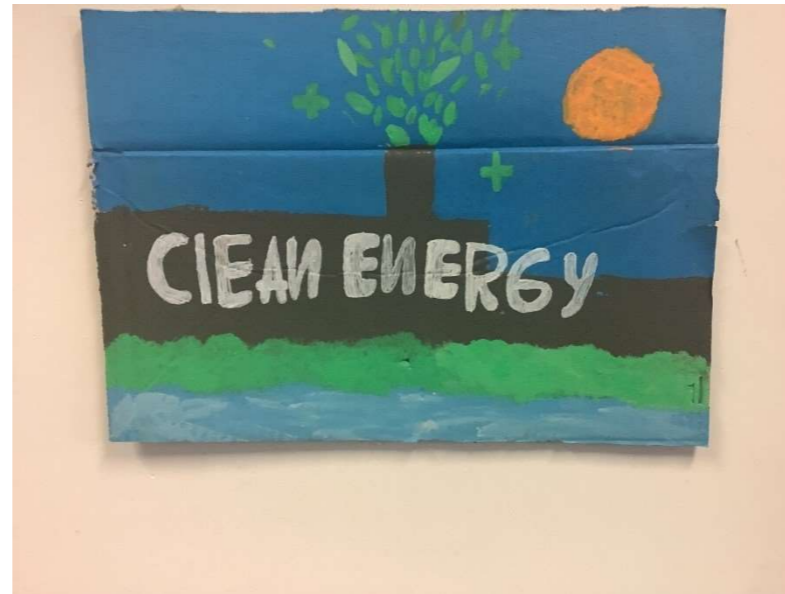
SDG 5 – “Empowerment” by Annaliese Gray

I sought to use this piece to EMPOWER women, to support all women, and to remind all women that they are just as important as everyone else in this world, deserving of equality.

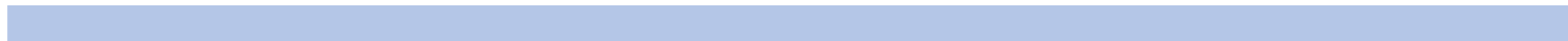
